JOHN JAMES AUDUBON CENTER AT MILL GROVE



Mill Grove, is the former home of the famous American naturalist, John James Audubon. Audubon lived here from the time he immigrated to America until his marriage. During that time Audubon built a substantial base of interest in ornithological art, and his experimentation resulted in the rapid development of his skills as an artist. While at Mill Grove he made many drawings and performed the first recorded experiment of bird banding in America. The house is situated overlooking the Perkiomen Creek and was an inspirational spot for Audubon.

Following our private tour of Mill Grove, there will be a birding walk over the center's property. A naturalist will guide the group and binoculars will be provided. For those not wishing to walk, there are a number of exhibits that can be viewed.
